Welcome to the new Better Broadband for Oxfordshire bulletin; bringing you up to date with the County Council's progress delivering broadband to Oxfordshire's communities that commercial providers had failed to serve.


We are proud to announce that we are on track to achieve our original goal, set for us back in 2013, of connecting 64,500

homes and businesses with superfast broadband across Oxfordshire by the end of 2015, and this has been achieved within our original budget also agreed in 2013.

But, we are not stopping there. With additional funding provided by the Department for Culture, Media & Sport, the District/City Councils and the Local Enterprise Zones, an additional £8.3m has been made available allowing us to bring superfast broadband to even more homes and businesses across Oxfordshire by the end of 2017. This will mean that by the end of 2017, 95% of premises will have access to superfast broadband services in Oxfordshire. **Councillor Nick Carter, Cabinet Member for Business and Customer Services**


Broadband delivery across Oxfordshire

Common questions

We were promised broadband by now - why has it still not arrived?

The majority of delayed cabinets have been due to elements out of our control such as traffic works to get the fibre to the cabinets; awaiting wayleaves to cross or use private land and getting power to the cabinet in order for the technology to work. **More information...**

When will I get superfast broadband?

If superfast broadband is not currently available for your home or business (**check online**), then **register your details** and we'll let you know when it becomes available.

Why am I not covered in your plans?

In areas where fibre broadband is not an option, Better Broadband for Oxfordshire will make use of other broadband technologies such as wireless, satellite and advanced copper. We're working to make sure at least 2MB/s is available to 100% of the county to order.

This Better Broadband for Oxfordshire sticker is placed onto a cabinet that has been delivered by the Better Broadband for Oxfordshire programme funding, when it has been fibre enabled. This means that the cabinet has gone live and is now ready to take orders for fibre broadband with your chosen Internet Service Provider (ISP).
